**IN CONFORMITY WITH THE JANUARY 1, 2026 ENACTMENT OF CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL 707 (DURAZO) AND LA CITY COUNCIL FILE 23-1114, THE WOODLAND HILLS-WARNER CENTER NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETING WILL BE CONDUCTED VIRTUALLY**

Every person wishing to address the Board by telephone must dial (669) 900-6833 and enter **880 5265 8362** and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial \*9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered.

**Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board’s jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to two minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.**

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.  
**California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).**

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.  
**California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).**

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5),**  
A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.

**California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6(A)).**

A legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph (5), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

**California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6(B)).**

**MOTION:**

As pertaining to the Conditional Use Permit request for full alcohol service both inside and on the two front patios of the Boiling Crab Restaurant in the El Camino Shopping Center at 23397 W. Mulholland Dr., the Woodland Hills-Warner Center Neighborhood Council Board hereby finds that:

*WHEREAS*, the Boiling Crab Restaurant has been operating with a CUB for beer and wine service for a number of years without any significant issues related to their alcohol service; and

*WHEREAS*, the Boiling Crab Restaurant wishes to expand their alcohol service to a full line of alcoholic beverages to better compliment their menu offerings and the patrons’ dining experience; and

*WHEREAS*, providing full alcohol service to both front patios may create some minor issues of monitoring both patio locations at the same time, but can be addressed by management of the Boiling Crab both quickly and responsibly; and

*WHEREAS*, the El Camino Shopping Center does have security teams patrolling the center at all times in which the restaurant is operating; and

*WHEREAS*, all requirements from the State Beverage Commission and the LAPD for serving a full line of alcoholic beverages have been complied with,

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that for the findings and recommendations stated herein, that application and plans submitted by The Boiling Crab Restaurant in the El Camino Shopping Center on 23397 W. Mulholland Dr., Woodland Hills, 91364, receive the support of the Board of the Woodland Hills-Warner Center Neighborhood Council (WHWCNC).

**(26-154) Motion to Approve up to \$3,300 to purchase WHWCNC Promotional Items**

Discussion and possible action

*5 minutes*

The WHWCNC hasn't purchased promotional outreach items since March 2024.

Therefore:

Motion to approve up to \$3,300 to purchase promotional items from Outreach budget line item in revised budget 4Imprint to be distributed at Community Events where the WHWCNC will be outreach tabling. The \$3,300 will be taken from Outreach line item in the revised budget.

Because of a daily maximum charge of \$1,000 on the WHWCNC credit card, and because each item is custom manufactured to order, which may result in multiple items shipping on the same date and/or all different dates, which may result in the need for the treasurer to obtain temporary daily spending limit increase(s) from the City Clerk. In addition, depending on when items ship on this order, combined with NCs other normal credit card spending, the treasurer may need to seek an override to the \$5,000 monthly spending limit on the NC credit card from the City Clerk.

To facilitate working with the City Clerk on any needed overrides, the order will be divided and placed as follows: *Each total amount has an "up to amount" to cover any unexpected funding issues that could occur related to tax, and shipping cost.*

- a. 600 Green WHWCNC Modesto Key Light (\$1.14each + Free set up, cost of tax and shipping) projected total cost \$822.39 or up to \$875
- b. 500 Blue WHWCNC Branded Value Grocery Totes (\$1.38 each + Free set up, cost of tax & shipping) projected cost is \$960.80 or up to \$1100
- c. 1,000 WHWCNC Branded Hand Fans (\$0.54 + \$free set-up, plus cost tax & shipping) projected cost is \$660.52 or up to \$700
- d. 825 WHWCNC Branded Power Clips (\$0.92 each + \$55 set-up, cost of tax & shipping) projected cost is \$558.48 or up to \$600

Total projected cost: \$3,002.29 or up to \$3,300

The board authorizes substitutions for similar items to ensure timely deliver. The Board also authorizes the Treasurer to move \$2500 from the NPG Budget as the Board can no longer file an NPG past June 1, 2026, and further directs the Treasurer to file an updated budget reflecting the change.

Comments: The Woodland Hills-Warner Center Neighborhood Council **supports** the Motion for Council File #26-0548 and adds the following comments:

**WE THEREFORE MOVE to support LAPD enforcement of helmet laws** to all rider on the Class1 (pedal-assist only up to 20 mph) and Class 2 (throttle and pedal-assist, capped at 20 mph). All riders under 18 are required to wear helmets, regardless of age. All riders must obey traffic laws.

**WE FURTHER MOVE that riders of Class 3** (pedal-assist, with speeds up to 28 mph), due to safety and speed concerns, **be restricted to road use only**. All riders are required to be 16 years or older and must wear a bicycle safety helmet, regardless of age. All riders must obey traffic Laws.

- New Rate (2026-2027): \$255.61 per license

EmpowerLA has been supplying Neighborhood Councils with one (1) Canva Pro license under the EmpowerLA team account. This license allows Neighborhood Councils to access branded templates and designs to support Neighborhood Council outreach with flyers, social media, and email graphics, and more. In light of the ongoing financial challenges the City of Los Angeles is facing, in Fiscal Year 2026-27, Neighborhood Councils will be required to opt into their Canva Pro license and be invoiced for the license(s) they wish to purchase.
