Motion to authorize expenditures of up to \$560 for website software licensing to support the website redesign, DIVI 5 implementation, meeting document management system, and The Events Calendar integration, itemized as follows:

Enables volunteer-friendly structured data entry for all committee pages, member directories, meeting schedules, and agenda metadata. Free version is insufficient for the repeater fields and options pages required.

Replaces custom-coded TEC display with volunteer-manageable DIVI 5 modules. Modules to be used: Event Feed, Carousel, Calendar, and Event Page. Ticket module not needed. Confirmed compatible with DIVI 5 (February 2026 release).			
3. Premio Folders	\$39	One-time	Folder-based organization of the WordPress Media Library
Selected over Real Media Library due to security concerns: Real Media Library exposes a REST API that was blocked by Wordfence during site operations and caused media library instability. Real Media Library has also been removed from the site. Premio Folders uses standard WordPress hooks without REST API exposure. One-time lifetime license.			
4. FS Poster	\$65/yr	Annual	Automatic social media posting to Facebook, Instagram, Threads, TikTok, and Bluesky
Publishes meeting notices and event announcements automatically when content is published to the website, reducing volunteer workload for manual cross-posting.			
5. AI Engine	\$59/yr	Annual	AI-assisted content generation within WordPress
Enables AI-assisted drafting of meeting descriptions, announcements, and social media posts for committee chairs and the Web Administrator, reducing writing time for recurring content.			
6. Claude API Usage	≤\$120/yr	Usage-based	AI service usage (est. \$10/month) required for AI Engine plugin
Token-based pricing; actual cost will vary with usage. \$10/month is a conservative estimate for a council with monthly meeting cycles.			
7. Real 3D FlipBook	\$69	One-time	PDF-optimized flipbook display for newsletters and formal council documents
EmbedPress Pro (already subscribed) handles general media embeds well, but renders PDFs as flat scrollable viewers. Real 3D FlipBook provides a page-turning experience specifically optimized for multi-page PDFs such as newsletters and annual reports, improving stakeholder engagement with Council publications. Item (26-xxx) — Motion to Authorize Hosting Migration and Domain Strategy

Discussion and possible action:

Motion to authorize the Web Administrator to migrate whcouncil.org to a higher-performance hosting provider and to adopt the domain strategy described below.

Background — Why Migrate Hosting

The council’s current Bluehost shared hosting plan has created significant performance issues with DIVI 5’s page builder due to shared CPU limitations. Volunteer administrators experience slow load times and timeouts when editing pages, which increases the barrier to maintaining the site. A performance-grade hosting plan will reduce maintenance friction and improve public page load speeds.

Cost context: Bluehost’s 3-year renewal is \$971 total (\$323/year) — for less storage and lower performance than the recommended Hosting.com MAX plan at approximately \$340/year. The annual cost difference between staying on Bluehost and migrating to Hosting.com MAX is approximately \$17/year, with substantially better performance and more storage in favor of the new host.

Recommended Option: Hosting.com MAX Plan

The Hosting.com MAX plan provides the performance and feature set appropriate for the council’s needs:

- Estimated Year 1 cost: ~\$110 (introductory pricing)
- Renewal rate: ~\$340/year
- Email hosting included (critical for preserving council email infrastructure during migration)
- Domain registration/management available through the same provider
- High-performance hosting suitable for DIVI 5 page builder operations

Domain Strategy

The board is asked to choose from the following options for the whwcnc.org domain:

Option A — Register whwcnc.org (Recommended):

Register whwcnc.org as a short-form alias that redirects to whcouncil.org. “WHWCNC” is the council’s official abbreviation used in all City communications, DONE filings, and public records. A .org domain reinforces the council’s nonprofit/civic character. Estimated cost: ~\$15–20/year at registration, ~\$15–22/year on renewal (separate from hosting plan). This is

modest enough to treat as a routine operating cost.

Option B — Do not register whwcnc.org:

Continue using whcouncil.org as the sole domain. Simpler, lower cost. Risk: whwcnc.org remains available for third parties to register.

Domain decisions are presented for board determination. The Web Administrator recommends Option A as a low-cost protective registration.

WP-Optimize Caching Plugin

WP-Optimize is currently installed for caching and performance optimization on the Bluehost shared hosting plan. Upon migration to Hosting.com MAX (or any managed WordPress host), the hosting provider’s built-in caching will likely supersede WP-Optimize. The Web Administrator will evaluate upon migration and deactivate WP-Optimize if the host’s native caching is sufficient, reducing plugin overhead.
