Dear John:

Your email concerning the submitted NPG grant to the Woodland Hills Neighborhood Council was forwarded to me.

Thank you for the invitation, yes we would be willing to virtually attend the committee meeting on January 5.

Parents, Educators/Teachers & Students in Action (PESA) is a community-based organization that provides educational support to K-12 students. Our educational support consists of tutoring, mental health counseling, career training, mentoring and workshops for both students and parents. We provide these services to all K-12 students.

We receive referrals to our program from the Los Angeles Police Department Juvenile Arrest Diversion Program (JADP). Which includes both the West Valley Division and the Topanga Division. We provide all of the above services to these youth in addition we evaluate the referred youth to determine if they are in need of special education services or additional educational support then what they are receiving. We have trained parent advocates that attend IEP meetings with the parents to help them obtain the services for their child. We have special education consultants on staff to assist in creating a support service plan with the input of the parent and the student when this is available, to present at the IEP meeting.

We have a strong relationship with the Parent and Community Engagement Unit of LAUSD for the Local District Northwest (PACENW), which encompasses Woodland Hills. Through our relationship with PACENW we are able to communicate our services to parents of needs, and receive referrals of students in need from this source as well.

In addition we have a strong presence both at Taft High School and Canoga Park High School by being the supporting nonprofit of the Teen Court program present at both of these schools. As a result we are able to provide services to students at both of these schools as well.

Also students who participate in our programs are eligible to join our Teen Court Alumni Association (TCAA) and continue to receive mentoring from us while they attend college. The TCAA members are eligible to be part time employees to assist us in providing the services outlined above.

I hope this answers your questions. Of course we will be available to go into more details and answer further questions you or your committee members may have at the meeting on January 5.
